## **Class and Panel Descriptions**

### **Led by The Spirit – AT Arneson, Lead Evangelist, Chicago Church of Christ**

Luke 4.2 Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for 40 days he was tempted by the devil. We each endure our own tests just as Jesus did. Issues of identity and how we view ourselves and the world as followers of Jesus.

### **Full of the Spirit – Ed Anton, Minister, Teacher, Hampton Roads Church of Christ**

Luke 4.1 Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness. To endure testing takes more than pushing through relying on our own strength to walk with God faithfully. It requires a deep dependence on God. A strong personal walk with God dependent on the Holy Spirit is the greatest resource anyone can have to stand up to the tests of our faith.

### **Powered by the Spirit – Ameer Burton, Minister, LA Church of Christ**

Luke 4.14 Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside. Just as Jesus emerged from his time of testing stronger and empowered this Sunday lesson will focus on our own ability to emerge from this weekend stronger and empowered to share with others the amazing gospel story.

### **Poisoned Soup – Chris Zillman, Lead Evangelist, Denver Church of Christ**

John 8.1-11 What happens when those wishing to trap Jesus bring a violator before him. The story of the woman caught in adultery sheds a great light on how our modern culture has little patience for a story like this. The world is filled with so much poison and mostly their answer is to rage at the bowl. How does living a repentant life help us refrain from responding to the poison we see and bear up under the weight of outrage in the world.

### **Allegiance – Michael Burns, Teacher, Minneapolis Church of Christ**

The principle of being a kingdom people and how the world challenges our allegiance to the kingdom and to God. How to process the political and racial tensions in our world as a disciple of Jesus. The power of the church as an alternative society to what we see in the world where swords have been beaten into plowshares and Jesus is the only king to whom we swear complete allegiance.

### **Tested by the Unexpected (Women's Class) - Marci Arneson, Women's Ministry Leader, Chicago Church of Christ**

Luke 24 The Emmaus Road. Jesus displays amazing patience, and a simple walk turns into deep learning. When God works different than we would, how does that pose a challenge to our ability to be non-anxious and to trust in his ways rather than our ways. The special challenges women face during difficult times to remain faithful. God just may be at work in your mundane moments.
